Theme of the Month - Fruits and Vegetables

Like all the previous weeks we made sure to give a fresh start to our young ones with the new theme “Fruits and Vegetables” with an objective to create and educate out Pre-Kindergartners about the importance of fruits and vegetables everyday.

By narrating the story “The Little Red Riding Hood” learners learnt how she took healthy fruits like apple, banana, pear, orange and mango for her sick grandma to make her feel better. They also learnt that talking to strangers can land us in trouble. Learners clearly understood the importance of washing the fruits before eating and the benefits of eating fresh fruits.

Different craft activities were planned for the learners to teach them new painting styles like apple stamping, bubble wrap painting on mango, spray painting for pear. Learners designed oranges beautifully by sticking circles and triangles. During the circle time learners discussed about their favourite fruit and why they like to eat it. Apple sorting was done with the red, green and yellow colour apples. Their gross motor skills were also worked upon by playing fruit rope jump and fruit wall touch games in the class and the corridors.

This week learners were introduced to the new letter “Pp” and its sound along with recalling the previously learnt letters S, A and T. Learners are now able to recognize all the numbers from 1 – 4.

Our tiny tots were engaged in all the activities with great zest, enthusiasm and vigour.

HOME ASSIGNMENTS

- Which fruit is hard from outside but soft from inside?
- Apart from cutting and eating raw fruits what all can be made from fruits ?
- Which bird can talk and its name begin with P?
- How many wheels does a car have?

WHAT WE LEARNT DURING THE WEEK

The following were our focused activities-

PERSONAL, SOCIAL, EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT:

Learners strengthened their bond with peers in the role play where they enacted as a fruit seller and the shopper.

COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE:

Our little champs are getting more confident with each passing day where they can clearly express themselves. They can express their likes and dislikes for a particular fruit being aware of the taste of these fruits.

EXPRESSIVE ARTS AND DESIGNS:

Learners were introduced to different art and craft activities to enhance their creativity. They did tearing, pasting, colouring activities to design different fruits.

UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD:

This week our super learners gained a good understanding that fruits grow on the trees and we get different colours of apples, mangoes and bananas.

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT:

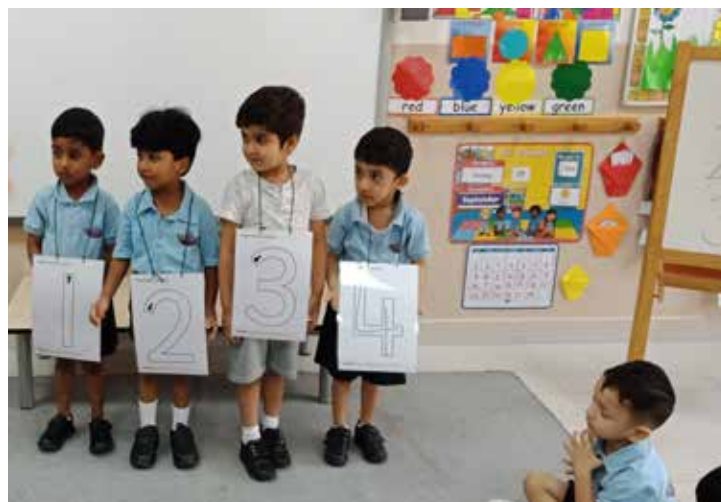
Outdoor play – The children explored the colourful play area as they played organized games long with their classmates thus developing their gross motor skills.

HOME CONNECTIONS:

- Discuss with family and friends about which fruit seeds we can eat.
- Revise phonic sounds of all the letters and sight words done so far.
- Practice writing numbers 1-9 with their number values.

WHAT WE LEARNT DURING THE WEEK

LITERACY:

- Learners were introduced to the letter “f” with the phonic sound, associated pictures, objects and song.
- Learners wrote letter “f” in their notebooks.
- Phonic recognition activities, blends and story sequencing activities were done.

MATHEMATICS:

- Recap of numbers 1-9 with their number value was done.
- Learners were introduced to Patterns. They recreated different patterns with the help of hands on activities.

UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD:

- Learners had an exposure to different cultures and participated in a discussion and quiz related to China.
- Learners were introduced to the sensory bin wherein they observed and discussed the similarities between a whole, sliced and skinned parts of different fruits.

EXPRESSIVE ARTS AND DESIGNS:

- Learners enjoyed making different kinds of fruits and vegetables.
- Learners made various creative things related to China.

PERSONAL, SOCIAL, EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT:

- Learners were observed for demonstrating friendly behavior initiating conversations and forming good relationships with peers and familiar adults.

COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE:

- Learners participated in a mystery bag game and discussed the features of the fruits hidden inside it.

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT:

- Learners learnt the technique of crawling through a tunnel.

WHAT WE LEARNT DURING THE WEEK

LITERACY:

Learners were introduced to the chopping of big words and make CVC words. They also revised the 'Opposite' words using various hands-on activities.

MATHEMATICS:

Learners revised the concept of 'Non Standard Measurement'. They practiced measuring the object's height and length using 'Non standard Measurement' method.

UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD:

Under the topic 'Germination of Plants' children learned about the life cycle of plants. They also discussed about the Friends of Plant- Sunlight, water and air. They observed the plants which they brought from home and discussed about the changes that took place. (Seed to sprout)

EXPRESSIVE ARTS AND DESIGNS::

Learners used their own choices of materials to create different stages of 'Life cycle of a plant'

PERSONAL, SOCIAL, EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT:

Children discussed about 'Lifecycle of plant'. They explained their own knowledge and understanding about lifecycle. They also participated in OLA (Outside Learning Area)activities where they discussed about traffic rules and traffic signs.

COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE:

During 'Global Awareness Program-One World One Family' session Children participated in discussion and learned about 'China'.

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT:

Learners learned to negotiate space successfully while playing . Racing and chasing games with other children, adjusting speed or changing direction to avoid obstacles were their most favorite activities.
