Theme of the Month - Fruits & Vegetables

As the topic of the month is “Fruits and Vegetables” all our activities revolved around it. This will also help our children in a great way to know and learn about different fruits. Our little learners were introduced to the fruits like kiwi, watermelon, cherry, pineapple and different berries.

To add to the excitement, we have created a tiny supermarket role play corner in our classes to enable children to buy and sell fruits and understand the importance of buying healthy food from the market.

Our learners enjoyed making watermelon and kiwi using paper plates and other resources. Making a pineapple and cherries by paper tearing and folding too kept them engrossed.

They had fun coloring and designing their fruit basket. Selecting the fruits they wanted to keep in their basket and why they liked the fruit helped them to express their liking towards the fruit. It was indeed a treat listening to them discuss why they liked a particular fruit.

After an ongoing recapitulation of letters s, a, t, p, the learners were introduced to the new letter “ l” along with its phonetic sound. Learners are able to comfortably recognize all the numbers from 1 – 5.

Overall , it was a great week of fun and learning with our adorable children.

WHAT WE LEARNT DURING THE WEEK

The following were our focused activities-

PERSONAL, SOCIAL, EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT:

Learners strengthened the bond with their peers in the role play where they took the roles of fruit seller and the shopper.

COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE:

Our little champs are getting more confident with each passing day where they can clearly express themselves. They can express their likes and dislikes for a particular fruit being aware of the taste of these fruits.

EXPRESSIVE ARTS AND DESIGNS:

Learners were introduced to different art and craft activities to enhance their creativity. They did tearing, pasting, colouring activities to design different fruits and fruit basket.

UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD:

This week learners learnt that fruits grow on the trees and plants.

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT:

Outdoor play – The children went for their outdoor activity and played the fruit rope jump game where they had to jump and bring a particular fruit called out by the teacher.

PE and swimming – The children practiced a few yoga postures in the PE class which helps in the development of Gross Motor Skills. They also learnt a few swimming techniques which encouraged the super champions to swim and catch the ball in the water. This activity also helped to develop their coordination and listening skills.





















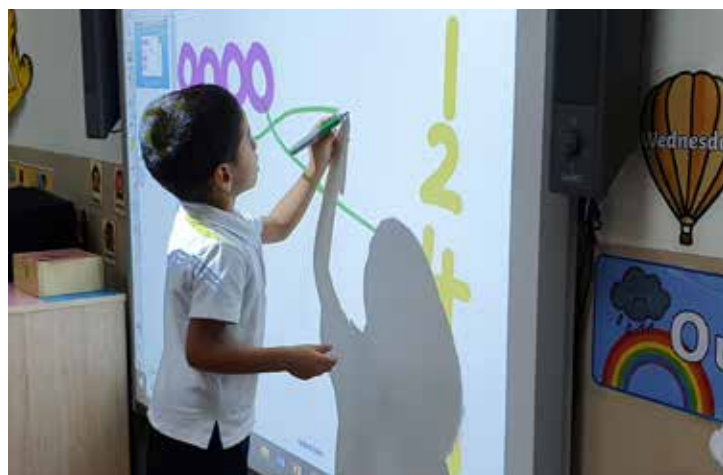

This week Kindergarten celebrated all things British. The children participated in interesting activities related to the United Kingdom. The week started with the Parent Representatives coming in and presenting an interactive ppt on UK. The children learnt about the food, the flag and the national animal/bird of UK.

The UK week culminated with a quiz. This was an exciting opportunity for children to gain a Global perspective.

WHAT WE LEARNT DURING THE WEEK

LITERACY:

- Learners were introduced to the letter “u” with the phonic sound, associated pictures, objects and song.
- Learners wrote letter “u” in their notebooks.
- Phonic recognition activities, blends and story sequencing activities were done.

MATHEMATICS:

- Recap of numbers 1-9 with their number value was done.
- Learners were introduced to Patterns. They recreated different patterns with the help of hands on activities.

UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD:

- Learners had an exposure to different cultures and participated in a discussion and quiz related to UK.
- Learners this week learnt to identify, analyse and differentiate between raw and cooked food.

EXPRESSIVE ARTS AND DESIGNS:

- Learners enjoyed making different kinds of fruits and vegetables.
- Learners made various creative things related to the UK.

PERSONAL, SOCIAL, EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT:

- Learners were observed for demonstrating friendly behavior initiating conversations and forming good relationships with peers and familiar adults.

COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE:

- Learners participated in an interactive discussion on raw and cooked food.

Learners were introduced to the concept of 'Basic Addition'. They practiced 'Basic Addition' using various hands-on activities.

UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD:

Under the topic 'Parts of plant' children learned about the different parts of plant. They observed the real plants and labelled it.

EXPRESSIVE ARTS AND DESIGNS::

Learners used their own choices of materials to create different parts of plants.

PERSONAL, SOCIAL, EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT:

Children discussed about the growth of plants. They explained their own knowledge and understanding about 'Parts of plants'.

COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE:

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT:

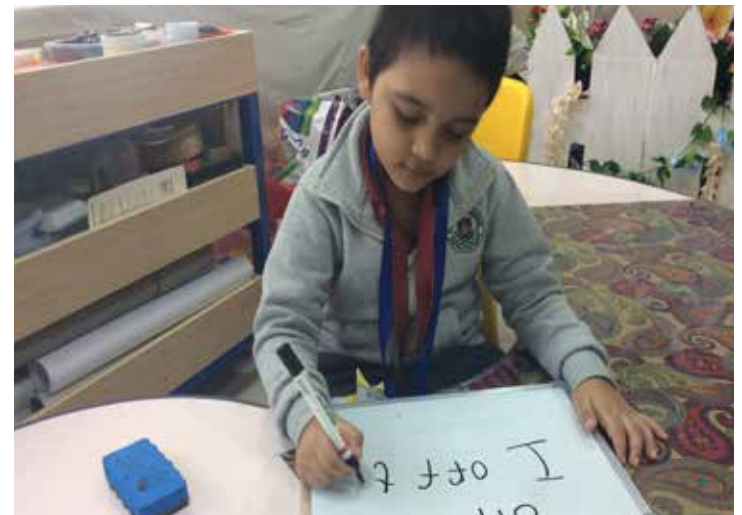
Learners learned to negotiate space successfully while playing . Racing and chasing games with other children, adjusting speed or changing direction to avoid obstacles were their most favourite activities.

س (seen) and ش (Sheen)





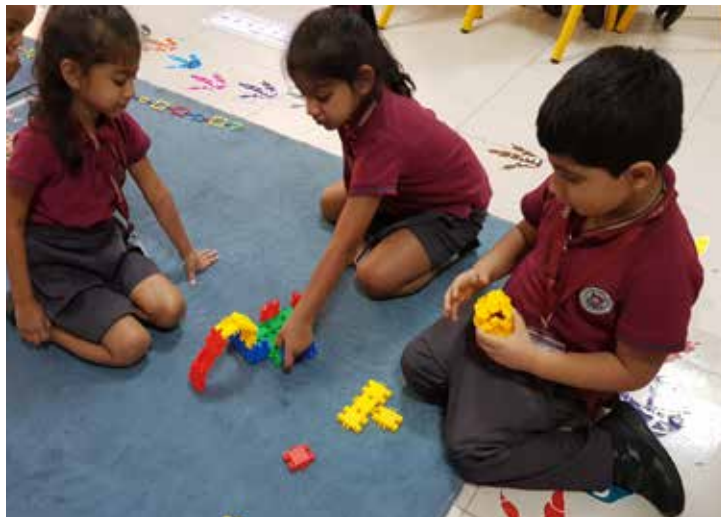


















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
