WHAT WE LEARNT DURING THE WEEK

The following were our focused activities-

PERSONAL. SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT:

COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE:

The little ones shared their experiences at the park. They spoke about how they have lots of fun, develop skills of sharing and caring as they engage in different types of games with their family and friends.

Outdoor play – Children had fun time playing on slides, swings, seesaws and enjoyed the pleasant weather.


PE- Children were engaged in different races to reinforce the concept of fast and slow

WHAT WE LEARNT DURING THE WEEK

The following were our focused activities-

LITERACY

- Phonic recognition activities and letter dictation from "a to z"
- (lower case) was done in the notebooks.
- Learners were introduced to 'ck' and 'qu' sound words like back, rock, neck, quilt, queen etc.

MATHEMATICS:

- · Recap of numbers 1-30 was done.
- · Learners wrote 21-30 in Tens and ones format in the notebooks.
- Introduction of full, half full and empty was done. Learners learned to compare and label different containers as full, half full and empty.
- · Introduction of before, after and between numbers was done.

UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD:

• Learners learnt to identify and talk about the different forms of water. They explored the different forms by doing various ice melting activities.

EXPRESSIVE ARTS AND DESIGNS:

 Learners used a spoon and glasses filled with various levels of water to make soft and loud music sound.

PERSONAL, SOCIAL, EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT:

 Learners waited patiently and took turns in passing the ball to each other and in kicking the ball carefully.

COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE:

• <u>Learners talked about the different ways of melting water and learnt new vocabulary</u> word related to the various activities that were done.

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT:

· Learners developed hand eye foot coordination through activities like kicking a ball.

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

WHAT WE LEARNT DURING THE WEEK

The following were our focused activities-

LITERACY

Learners were introduced to Action Words They learned that an Action Word tells us what is being done. They learned the new sight words 'please' and 'ride' and revised all the sight words learned so far.

MATHEMATICS:

Learners were introduced to the concept of 'Handling Money". They learned the difference between coins and notes, different denomination of UAE Dirhams. They learned calculating money using the concept of addition and subtraction. They pretended to go for shopping, buy few things and calculate. Most importantly, they also learnt about why and how to save money and use it wisely.

UNDERSTANDING THE WORLD:

Under the topic 'At the Seaside' Children learned about the things found and done at the seaside. They created a list of things they carry along while going at Seaside. They conducted an investigation by trying different paper eyeglasses which color glasses our suitable to wear on beach to protect the eyes from strong Sunrays.

EXPRESSIVE ARTS AND DESIGNS:

Learners used their own choice of materials to create Light House.

PERSONAL, SOCIAL, EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT:

Children discussed about the 'Seaside' they expressed their thoughts and shared their knowledge about Seaside and fun activity they do there.

COMMUNICATION AND LANGUAGE:

Learners listened and interacted effectively during circle time and discussed about 'Safety' near the sea.

PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT:

Children experimented different ways of moving. They also practiced jumping and landing appropriately.

ARABIC

During Transition activity this week, children visited Grade 1 and learned Arabic with Grade 1 Arabic teacher. The children are being given exposure to a Grade 1 classroom setting and an experience of learning Arabic with their senior buddies. Learners learned Arabic letter & it's sound.























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
