

"Mental illness is nothing to be ashamed of, but stigma and bias shame us all." – Bill Clinton

Combatting Mental Stigma in Asian Households



In Asia, stigmatizing those who suffer from mental illness is pervasive. People with mental illnesses frequently stigmatized and subjected to discrimination throughout Asia. The social gap grows as a result of the perception

that people with mental illness are violent and dangerous. Mental illness is largely treated by spiritual, religious, and magical means. Family members' stigmatization is prevalent. In addition, it is vital to be concerned about societal rejection and devaluation of families that have mentally ill members. This is especially true in terms of marriage, divorce, and marital separation. The lack of resources on a personal and financial level is Asia's most pressing issue with mental health treatment. Consequently, the majority of mental health experts are found in cities. This makes it harder to get care and contributes to the stigmatization of those who are mentally ill. which is extremely essential for their growth as a person. People need to realize that a healthy body is nothing without an equally healthy mind.

Combatting Stigmas Around Mental Health In Asian Households



Stigmatization is the act of treating someone unfairly by publicly disapproving them, steps need to be taken to ensure there is stigmatization of children based their on home circumstances.

The most urgent problem of mental health care in Asia is the lack of personal & financial resources. Compared to Western countries, there is a widespread tendency to stigmatize and discriminate against people with mental illness in Asia. People with mental illness are considered dangerous and aggressive which in turn increases social distance. The role of supernatural, religious and magical approaches to mental illness is prevailing. The pathway to care is often shscepticismepticism towards mental health services and the treatments offered. Stigma experienced by family members is pervasive.

The research studies & review revealed that the stigmatization of people with mental illness is widespread in Asia.

How to overcome it?

Interventions that promote physical exercise and a healthy diet can improve quality of life and may promote recovery for people with mental health issues. Studies suggested implementing a community-based lifestyle program for adults with mental health issues to inform the design of such interventions and assess their impact on quality of life and recovery. Mixed methods were used to evaluate week-long interventions involving weekly group gym-based exercise sessions and nutritional education. I would like to list a few measures that seem to be constructive in their approach and can prevent

this crisis to a considerable extent with a positive attitude;

- 1. Talking openly with family, and friends, or using social media.
- 2. Promoting the idea that physical and mental illnesses are equal.
- 3. Avoiding the use of language that may be negative or discriminating.
- 4. Know the facts. Educate yourself about mental illness including substance use disorders.
- 5. Focus on the positive. ...
- 6. Support people. ...
- 7. Be aware of your attitudes and behaviour. ...

Stigmatization is not a state of illness rather it is the mindset of the people, so understand the truth about how people are getting affected by this and traumatized. Let's work for a better tomorrow and refrain from such activities.

In the United States, mental health issues have less stigmatization compared to Asia. In most cases, therapy, counselling, support networks, prescriptions and organizations are accessible to help these people

However, in Asian cultures, the mere mention of "depression" or "anxiety" will get you disapproving looks from people. The model minority myth enforces the idea that all Asians are fully-integrated, intelligent individuals and have overcome racial bias. This places pressure on those within this group to meet these standards or expectations. Furthermore, it encourages people to hide their historical influences and deny the fact that their life includes frustration, let-downs, setbacks, failures, pain, and loss that everyone experiences. By presenting one-dimensional, uncomplicated, and "universal" Asian characters in media portrayals, this stereotype is further reinforced.

The most effective strategy to reduce stigma is to educate yourself about mental health facts and engage positively with those who are suffering from mental illness. Moreover, promoting the notion that physical and mental diseases are interchangeable and avoiding the use of potentially harsh or discriminatory words can help dissolve the stigma surrounding mental health. Seeking treatment and being upfront and honest about it with others will help prevent self-shaming and value empowerment over shame.

Combating stigmas around mental health in asian households



is common knowledge that mental health and well-being exist in a world fraught with stigma. Stigma often comes from a lack of understanding or fear. Combating health mental stigmas, in general, is difficult as is. But it's especially

difficult for certain ethnic and racial groups, for example, the Asian community.

In most Asian cultures, the concept of "family pride" is extremely prevalent. What this means is --- people from these communities tend to care more about their face value, that is, their

moral standing in society rather than their internal struggles. In Asian households, seeking professional help, as well as, even acknowledging mental illnesses are looked down upon. Many victims are reluctant to even break the news to their immediate family. This is how severely stigmatized mental health is among these communities.

There are certain traditional values that contribute to the deep-rooted mental health stigmas in Asian households. Some are how the members of this community believe mental illness to be a sign of weakness and a source of shame for their families.

A study "Factors that influence Asian communities' access to mental health care" by Dianne Wynadenn showed how seeking professional help for mental well-being was the last resort for many Asian people struggling with mental health. It also talked about how these people would go and pray in temples and churches rather than voluntarily seeking treatment. This shows how the religious aspect comes into play. Many sections of the Asian community believe in concepts like "karma". They think anything bad that is happening to someone is because they must have done something horrible in their "past life". This, again, contributes to the feeling of guilt and shame people feel when they are struggling mentally, within this community.

All these factors make it exceptionally difficult for people struggling with mental illnesses in Asian households to seek help.

The only thing we can do is to spread awareness. This is not something that can be achieved overnight, as it is part of a multi-generationally reinforced mind-set. However, seeing as the concept of mental well-being has been gaining importance in recent days, it does not seem like something that is unattainable.

Combatting stigmas revolving around mental illnesses in Asian households



Fear or a lack of understanding are two common causes of stigma. The media's inaccurate or misleading portrayals of mental illness have a role in both of those issues. While the public may recognize the medical or hereditary nature

of a mental health issue and the necessity for treatment, a review of studies on stigma reveals that many people still have a negative image of those with mental illnesses. Released in April 2020, a report suggested that the blockbuster movie Joker depicts the protagonist having a mental disorder who turns violent. The study found that the movie was "related to increased levels of prejudice toward persons with mental illness."

The stigma associated with mental illness is a problem in some diverse ethnic and racial communities and can make it very difficult for individuals of those groups to seek mental health services. Cultural norms such as strong family values, emotional control and avoiding humiliation in society may hinder in the path of accessing professional care. In many Asian cultures, discussing mental health is still considered a taboo, promoting the notion that such matters should be kept secret and that mental illness is shameful.

The greatest method to counter stigmas is to educate yourself on the subject and interact positively with those who are affected by mental illness. Talking openly with family, friends, or using social media; promoting the idea that physical and mental illness are equal; avoiding the use of language that may be negative or discriminating can also majorly help in combatting the stigmas surrounding mental illness.

Combatting stigmas revolving around mental illnesses in Asian households

One University of Maryland study examined the mental health needs of young Asian American adults. The researchers discovered that these people experienced a variety of stresses and

adults. The researchers discovered that these people experienced a variety of stresses and issues that made them reluctant to get mental health care. They explained that mental health was a taboo topic in their communities.

For some, the pressure of being part of a "model minority" stood in the way of treatment. They describe themselves as intelligent, industrious, and entirely in charge of their lives. For many, admitting to "weakness" would be a letdown to the entire community.

There are many things we can do to reduce and eventually eradicate stigmas revolving around mental illnesses. As students, we see many of our friends facing a variety of mental illnesses, most common being depression and insomnia. If they tell you about it, be supportive! Tell them that they will come out of it and you are going to be there whenever they need someone to rant to. Try to make them understand that maybe telling their parents can help them get professional help, which many times may be necessary.














Middle School
